St. Maria Goretti is a powerful intercessor for our times. Our Lord is working through this little saint to bring about great healing from sexual abuse, great hope for each of us when we fall, and great courage to lovingly name sin and defend purity in every age and state of life.

Her story exemplifies the importance of the healing power of forgiveness to remove the obstacles of false shame due to sexual sin and highlights the power of purity to embolden us to love Our Lord with courage. It also gives witness to the truth that lust leads to death (Alessandro's crime of passion), and authentic love rooted in forgiveness and purity leads to eternal life (Maria extended the mercy of God to her murderer).

She is best known for the heroic act of forgiveness she granted to her housemate Alessandro Serenelli on her deathbed after he attempted to rape her and brutally stabbed her,

causing 30 hours of excruciating pain, and ultimately leading to her death.

Although Alessandro was slow to repent, Maria later appeared to him and gave him fourteen lilies, signifying forgiveness for each of her stab wounds and bringing about his conversion. Alessandro served the remainder of his prison sentence as a model inmate, gained forgiveness and affection from Maria's mother and later became a Capuchin lay brother.

While Maria's heroism was impressive, it was only made possible from the grace of God, which Maria cooperated with in the little and big things of life.

As members of the Goretti Group, we seek to follow her example and grow in Gorettian spirituality. Modeled after Maria, we seek to be hard-working, forgiving and compassionate, optimistic, courageous, and pure. We have a love and devotion to our families, to Mother Mary, to the Eucharist, and to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In all of this, we seek to rediscover authentic masculinity, authentic femininity and to be witnesses to the joy of pure love.

We invite you to join us in this journey, but regardless of your affiliation, we hope that this little booklet will be an instrument of great graces for you. May it strengthen your prayer life and lead you into the depths of the Sacred Heart of Jesus where you will find great healing, deep joy and the truest fulfillment of the deepest desires of your heart.

Daily Prayer

(1) Morning Offering

O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer You my prayers, works, joys and sufferings of this day for all the intentions of Your Sacred Heart, in union with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world, in reparation for my sins, for the intentions of all my relatives and friends, and in particular for the intentions of the Holy Father. My beloved Father, all my confidence is in thee. Let it not be said that I invoked thee in vain; and since thou art able to obtain everything before Jesus and Mary, show me that thy goodness equals thy power. Amen.

(9) The Memorare

Remember, most loving Virgin Mary, never was it heard that anyone, who turned to you for help, was left unaided. Inspired with this confidence, though burdened by my sins, I run to your protection for you are my mother. Mother of the Word of God, do not despise my words of pleading, but be merciful and hear my prayer. Amen. (Emergency Novena of Blessed Mother Teresa - say 9 times)

(10) Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already

there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

Is there anything in particular that satisfies or displeases God, my Father? Have I tried to do God's will in my various activities today? Have I performed them with this intention?

Have I tried hard, sincerely, and fervently, to fulfill my spiritual commitments well?

Have I fulfilled the duties of my state in life honestly and responsibly, in a spirit of service?

Have I sought God's glory and the good of others more than my own personal interests?

Have I lived out Christian charity in thoughts, words, attitudes, and actions? In other words, have I done good to others by helping to make them happy, especially those closest to me – being patient, not talking badly of them or holding grudges, forgiving, and helping out as much as I could whenever I had the opportunity?

How well have I carried out my mission as an apostle? Did I take the necessary steps and seize the opportunities to win souls for Christ?

Do I have clear apostolic goals and have I striven to meet them? Was I generous in giving my time and resources to further Christ's interest?

What omissions was I guilty of today?

Have I taken care to form a sensitive conscience?

Do I know what my root defect is (lack of devotion, pride, self-love, vanity, laziness,

faultfinding, envy, gluttony, lack of charity, frivolity and superficiality, sensuality, neglectfulness, irresponsibility in my work, individualism, indifference of the common good..) What have I done today to improve? What was the most positive thing in my day? What was the most negative thing in my day?

(16) Act of Contrition

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee, and I detest all my sins, because I dread the loss of heaven and the pains of hell, but most of all because they offend Thee, my God, who art all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of Thy grace, to do my penance, to sin no more, and to avoid the near occasion of sin. Amen.

(17) Night Prayer

Visit this house, we beg you, Lord, and banish from it the deadly power of the evil one. May your holy angels dwell here to keep us in

peace, and may your blessing be always upon us. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayers for Chastity

(18) Prayer Against Temptation

Behold me, O my God, at Your feet! I do not deserve mercy, but O my Redeemer, the blood which You have shed for me encourages me and obliges me to hope for it. How often I have offended You, repented, and yet I have again fallen into the same sin. O my God, I wish to amend, and in order to be faithful to You, I will place all my confidence in You. I will, whenever I am tempted, instantly have recourse to You. Until now, I have trusted in my own promises and resolutions and have neglected to recommend myself to You in my temptations. This has been the cause of my repeated failures. From this day forward, be You, O Lord, my strength, and this shall I be able to do all things, for "I can do all things in Him who strengthens me." Amen.

(19) Deliverance from Lust

Father, I come boldly before Your throne of grace and mercy to find help and strength in my time of need. Lord Your word says to watch and pray so that we will not enter into temptation, for we know that the spirit is willing, but Father my flesh is weak. Lord, I submit myself to You, for Your word says that if we submit ourselves unto You, that we could resist the enemy and he would flee from us.

Lord I am fully submitted to You, all that I am, all that I ever hope to be. I surrender unto You. Father, I am weak but thou art strong, I know in my weakness You are made strong. I know that my strength is not in my will to withstand the devil and his many temptations, but my faith, my strength, my hope is in You.

Therefore, Lord I confess that I am strong in You, and in the power of Your might. Father, in the name of Jesus, I cast down every wicked, lustful, lascivious, and unclean thought of the enemy in the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth. I refuse to allow any thoughts of the enemy to

enter in; I dismiss them from me in the name of Jesus.

Father, I pray that You will cause me to think upon those things which are pure, honest, and of a good report, and I pray that You will not allow my mind to wander into idleness, but to stay upon the name of Jesus. Father, I thank You for revealing the evil lustful spirit that was trying to confuse me. I thank You for not allowing me to be drawn away by his words of flattery, his lustful eyes, or his gifts of deceit. I thank You for not allowing me to be overcome with lust in my eyes, for I know the eyes are the door to the heart, and Your words says to guard my heart with all diligence.

So Father, please help me to guard my heart by the words that I speak. Father, I pray that You will place upon me the whole amour of God, so that I will always be able to stand against the tricks of the enemy. I pray that You will lead and deliver me from every temptation of lust, sin and evil.

In the name of Jesus, I take authority over Satan, every principality, every evil spirit, and every spirit of wickedness in high places. I bind them up in the name of Jesus Christ and render them helpless from operating in my life. In the name of Jesus I bind and cast off every spirit of lust, adultery, fornication, lasciviousness, and uncleanness in my life.

Father, I surrender my body to you as a living sacrifice, and I recognize that my body is the temple of the Almighty Living God and a dwelling place for His Holy Spirit and I rejoice in knowing that the blood of Jesus Christ covers me. Satan, in the name of Jesus, every stronghold, you have tried to bring against me has been rendered helpless, powerless and ineffective to operate in my life, by the authority of Jesus Christ!

I put off all forms of lust and put on the new nature of righteousness, purity, and honesty. Jesus has defeated Satan in my life, and now you are under my feet, and your power of lust and sin is broken in my life.

Father, I thank You for hearing my prayer, and delivering me from the tricks of the enemy. I thank You for Your word and how it is established in my heart and in my life. I thank You for giving me power over the enemy, I thank You for strengthening me so that I will not defile my body, and that it will be a temple for the Holy Spirit. Thank You Lord, for restoring me, for cleansing me, and for forgiving me for my weakness. I praise You; I give You all the glory and say Hallelujah to the name of Jesus.

In Jesus name, Amen.

(20) Prayer to Mary for Purity

Mary, Mother most pure, and Joseph, chaste guardian of the Virgin, to you I entrust the purity of my soul and body. I beg you to plead with God for me that I may never for the remainder of my life soil my soul by any sin of impurity. I earnestly wish to be pure in thought, word and deed in imitation of your own holy purity. Obtain for me a deep sense of modesty, which will be reflected in my external conduct. Protect my eyes, the windows of my

soul, from anything that might dim the luster of a heart that must mirror only Christ-like purity. And when the “Bread of Angels” becomes my food in Holy Communion, seal my heart forever against the suggestions of sinful pleasures. Finally, may I be among the number of those of whom Jesus spoke, “Blessed are the pure of heart for they shall see God.” Amen.

(21) Prayer for Purity (by St. Thomas Aquinas)

Dearest Jesus! I know well that every perfect gift, and above all others that of chastity, depends upon the most powerful assistance of Your Providence, and that without You a creature can do nothing.

Therefore, I pray You to defend, with Your grace, chastity and purity in my soul as well as in my body. And if I have ever received through my senses any impression that could stain my chastity and purity, may You, Who are the Supreme Lord of all my powers, take it from me, that I may with an immaculate heart advance in Your love and service, offering

myself chaste all the days of my life on the most pure altar of Your Divinity. Amen.

the torments that are causing anxiety in my life. I beg you, in a particular way, to heal the underlying source of my sinfulness. I beg you to come into my life and heal the psychological harms that struck me in my childhood and from the injuries they have caused throughout my life. Lord Jesus, you know my burdens. I lay them on your Good Shepherd's Heart. I beseech you—by the merits of the great open wound in your heart—to heal the small wounds that are in mine.

Heal my memories, so that nothing that has happened to me will cause me to remain in pain and anguish, filled with anxiety. Heal, O Lord, all those wounds that have been the cause of evil that is rooted in my life. I want to forgive all those who have offended me. Look to those inner sores that make me unable to forgive. You who came to forgive the afflicted of heart, please, heal my wounded and troubled heart.

Heal, O Lord Jesus, all those intimate wounds that are the root cause of my physical illness. I offer you my heart. Accept it, Lord, purify it and give me the sentiments of your Divine Heart. Heal me, O Lord, from the pain caused

by the death of my loved ones. Grant me to regain peace and joy in the knowledge that you are the Resurrection and the Life. Make me an authentic witness to your resurrection, your victory over sin and death, and your loving presence among all men. Amen.

(27) Prayer for Healing #1

Lord, You invite all who are burdened to come to You. Allow your healing hand to heal me. Touch my soul with Your compassion for others. Touch my heart with Your courage and infinite love for all. Remember not my iniquities, but, more especially, my sorrow for the offenses I have committed against You. I long to be true to Your Word, and pray that You will love me and come to make Your dwelling place within me. I promise to give You praise and glory in love and in service all the days of my life. Amen.

(30) Prayer for the Addicted

Enfold him/her in Your love and restore him/her to freedom of God's children. Lord, look with compassion on all those who have lost their health and freedom. To those who care for them, grant patience and understanding and a love that perseveres. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

(31) St. Jude's Prayer for the Addiction

God of life, You made me in Your perfect image, to live in Your love and to give You glory, honor and praise. Open my heart to Your healing power. Come, Lord Jesus, calm my soul just as you whispered "Peace" to the stormy sea. St. Jude, most holy Apostle, in my need I reach out to you. I beg you to intercede for me

that I may find strength to overcome my illness. Bless all those who struggle with addiction. Touch them, heal them, reassure them of the Father's constant love. Remain at my side, St. Jude, to chase away all evil temptations, fears, and doubts. May the quiet assurance of your loving presence illuminate the darkness in my heart and bring lasting peace. Amen.

Dear Lord, Thank you for calling me to be a part of your team and of your family. I know that through my baptism, you renewed my spirit and made me your noble son/daughter. I know that I am the crown of creation and that everything you make is good. My body, my sexuality, my desire for intimacy is all good. Help me to purify my mind and heart that I may more perfectly love as you do. Help me to see the gift of my masculinity and femininity as a means to remember your intimate love for me and the rest of your bride the Church. May my witness today be an invitation to everyone I meet to delve into the depths of your Sacred Heart where they will find mercy, peace and everlasting joy.

Dispel any fear that I might have and enable me to be a joyful giver. Take each breath, each step, each mile, each prayer and each cheer, and let my body glorify you. In the Sacred and Immaculate Hearts of Jesus & Mary, Amen.

I fear all from my own weakness and malice, but placing my entire confidence in Thee, O Heart of Love, I hope all from Thine infinite Goodness. Annihilate in me all that can displease or resist Thee. Imprint Thy pure love so deeply in my heart that I may never forget

Thee or be separated from Thee. I beseech Thee, through Thine infinite Goodness, grant that my name be engraved upon Thy Heart, for in this I place all my happiness and all my glory, to live and to die as one of Thy devoted servants. Amen.

(36) The Renewal of the Consecration of the Family to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Most sweet Jesus, humbly kneeling at Your feet, we renew the consecration of our family to Your Divine Heart. May You be our King forever. In You we have full and entire confidence. May Your spirit penetrate our thoughts, our desires, our words and our works. Bless our undertakings, share in our joys, in our trials and in our labors. Grant us to know You better, to love You more, to serve You without faltering.

By the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Queen of Peace, set up Your kingdom in our country. Enter closely into the midst of our families and make them Your own through the solemn Enthronement of Your Sacred Heart, so that

soon one cry may resound from home to home: "May the triumphant Heart of Jesus be everywhere loved, blessed and glorified forever!" Honor and glory to the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. Sacred Heart of Jesus, protect our families! Amen.

(37) Act of Confidence in Divine Mercy (of St. Claude de la Colombiere)

Lord, behold a soul that is in the world so that Thou may exercise Thine admirable mercy to make it shine before heaven and earth. Others glorify Thee by showing, through fidelity and constancy, the power of Thy grace and how sweet and generous Thou art to those who are faithful to Thee.

As for me, I will glorify Thee by manifesting how good Thou art to sinners. In me Thou will show that Thy mercy is superior to all our malice, that nothing can exhaust it, and that no relapse, however shameful and culpable it may be, should make a sinner lose hope in Thy forgiveness. My beloved Redeemer, I have offended Thee gravely. But it would be worse

still if I add to my offenses the horrible outrage of thinking that Thou art not so good as to forgive me.

In vain Thine enemy—who is also mine—sets new snares for me daily. He may cause me to cast away everything except the hope I have in Thy mercy. Even though I fall a hundred times, and my sins were a hundred times more horrible than what they are, I will always continue to hope in Thee. Amen.

(38) The Universal Prayer (attributed to Pope Clement XI)

Lord, I believe in you: increase my faith. I trust in you: strengthen my trust. I love you: let me love you more and more. I am sorry for my sins: deepen my sorrow. I worship you as my first beginning, I long for you as my last end, I praise you as my constant helper, and call on you as my loving protector. Guide me by your wisdom, correct me with your justice, comfort me with your mercy, protect me with your power.

I offer you, Lord, my thoughts: to be fixed on you; my words: to have you for their theme; my actions: to reflect my love for you; my sufferings: to be endured for your greater glory. I want to do what you ask of me: in the way you ask, for as long as you ask, because you ask it. Lord, enlighten my understanding, strengthen my will, purify my heart, and make me holy.

Help me to repent of my past sins and to resist temptation in the future. Help me to rise above my human weaknesses and to grow stronger as a Christian. Let me love you, my Lord and my God, and see myself as I really am: a pilgrim in this world, a Christian called to respect and love all whose lives I touch, those under my authority, my friends and my enemies. Help me to conquer anger with gentleness, greed by generosity, apathy by fervor. Help me to forget myself and reach out toward others.

Make me prudent in planning, courageous in taking risks. Make me patient in suffering, unassuming in prosperity. Keep me, Lord, attentive at prayer, temperate in food and

drink, diligent in my work, firm in my good intentions. Let my conscience be clear, my conduct without fault, my speech blameless, my life well-ordered. Put me on guard against my human weaknesses. Let me cherish your love for me, keep your law, and come at last to Your salvation.

Teach me to realize that this world is passing, that my true future is the happiness of heaven, that life on earth is short, and the life to come eternal. Help me to prepare for death with a proper fear of judgment, but a greater trust in your goodness. Lead me safely through death to the endless joy of heaven. Grant this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Precious Blood of Thy Beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lamb without blemish or spot, in reparation for my sins and for the sins of all Thy priests.

On the Hail Mary beads:

By Thy Precious Blood, O Jesus, purify and sanctify Thy priests.

In Place of the Glory be to the Father:

O Father, from whom all fatherhood in heaven and on earth is named, have mercy on all thy priests, and wash them in the Blood of the Lamb.

On the “Our Father” bead before each decade say: Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of your dearly beloved son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

On the ten “Hail Mary” beads of each decade say:

For the sake of his sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

After the last decade, recite the following prayers:

(3x) Holy God, Holy mighty one, Holy immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world. Then, (3x) Jesus I trust in You!

Closing Prayer: Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us, and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments, we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence, submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.

Amen.

(58) Merciful Mysteries for the Holy Rosary

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1. Pardon of the Sinful Woman

[†Jesus]...said to Simon: “Do you see this woman? When I entered your house you did not give me water for my feet, but she has bathed them with her tears and wiped them with her hair. You did not anoint my head with oil, but she anointed my head with ointment. So I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven; hence, she has shown great love.” (Luke 7:44, 46-47).

2. The Father Forgives His Lost Son

While he was still a long way off his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. His son said to him, “Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son.” But his father ordered his servants: “Quickly, bring out the finest robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Take the fatted calf and slaughter it.

Then let us celebrate with a feast, because this son of mine was dead, and has come to life; he was lost and has been found.” (Luke 15:20-24)

3. Jesus Forgives the Woman Caught In Adultery

†Jesus bent down and began to write on the ground with his finger. But when they continued asking him, he straightened up and said to them: “Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.” Again, he bent down and wrote on the ground. And in response, they went away one by one, beginning with the elders. So he was left alone with the woman before him. Then †Jesus straightened up and said to her: “Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?” She replied, “No one, sir.” Then †Jesus said, “Neither do I condemn you. Go, [and] from now on do not sin anymore.” (John 8:6-11)

4. The Crucified Criminal Receives Mercy

Now one of the criminals hanging there reviled †Jesus, saying, “Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us.” The other, rebuking him, said in reply, “Have you no fear of God, for you are subject to the same condemnation? And indeed, we have been condemned justly... but this man has done nothing criminal.” Then

he said, “†Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.” He replied to him, “Amen I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise.” (Luke 23:39-43)

5. Jesus Institutes the Sacrament of Reconciliation

†Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, “Peace be with you.” When he had said this, he showed them His hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. [†Jesus] said to them again, “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.” And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, “Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained.” (John 20:19-23)

(59) St. Michael Combat Chaplet

Invocation on the Medal:

A Message from the Murderer

I am now almost 80 years old. I am close to the end of my days. Looking back at my past, I recognize that in my early youth I followed a false road—an evil path that led to my ruin.

Through the content of printed magazines, immoral shows, and bad examples in the media, I saw the majority of the young people of my day following evil without even thinking twice. Unworried, I did the same thing.

There were faithful and practicing Christian believers around me, but I paid no attention to them. I was blinded by a brute impulse that pushed me down the wrong way of living.

At the age of 20, I committed a crime of passion, the memory of which still horrifies me today. Maria Goretti, now a saint, was my good angel whom God placed in my path to save me. Her words both of rebuke and forgiveness are still imprinted in my heart. She prayed for me, interceding for her killer. Thirty years in prison followed.

If I had not been a minor in Italian law I would have been sentenced to life in prison. Nevertheless, I accepted the sentence I received as something I deserved.

Resigned, I atoned for my sin. Little Maria was truly my light, my protectress. With her help, I served those 27 years in prison well. When society accepted me back among its members, I tried to live honestly. With angelic charity, the sons of St. Francis, the minor Capuchins of the Marches, welcomed me among them not as a servant, but as a brother. I have lived with them for 24 years.

Now I look serenely to the time in which I will be admitted to the vision of God, to embrace my dear ones once again, and to be close to my guardian angel, Maria Goretti, and her dear mother, Assunta.

May all who read this letter of mine desire to follow the blessed teaching of avoiding evil and following the good. May all believe with the faith of little children that religion with its precepts is not something one can do without. Rather, it is

true comfort, and the only sure way in all of life's circumstances—even in the most painful.
